MA Acting for Stage, Screen & Radio

For entry in September 2023, there are two stages of the audition process for the MA Acting for Stage Screen & Radio. First Round auditions will take place online. Recall auditions will take place in person.

1. Your First-Round Audition

All candidates will be invited to attend a first-round audition in support of their application. The audition will take place online, via Zoom. Once we receive your application, we will email you with further details. Auditions are likely to start from December 2022 and you will receive details regarding booking your audition via email as soon as possible.

Please follow the guidance below:

Audition Speeches

Candidates should prepare either:

 One modern / contemporary speech (written after 1956) and one speech from the Elizabethan / Jacobean period

or

• Two contrasting modern / contemporary speeches (written after 1956)

There is no specific advantage in choosing one option over the other, it is up to the individual candidate.

Please note that:

- The speeches should be taken from published plays and each speech must last no longer than two
 minutes.
- Speeches can be edited, as long as they continue to flow and make sense.
- The speeches can be translated from any language.
- The speeches may have been originally written for a gender different to your own.
- Candidates should not perform their own material.
- We advise candidates to avoid overused speeches and texts taken from film or TV scripts.

Candidates will be invited to perform their chosen pieces, to an audition panel comprised of members of the Acting programme staff and / or external, professional practitioners. The panel may choose to redirect one of your pieces. Please allow up to 15 minutes for your audition.

Following your first-round audition, we will inform you in writing whether:

- We would like to invite you to attend a recall audition.
- You have not been successful on this occasion.

2. Final Recall Auditions

Final Recall auditions take place in-person and include:

- A final recall acting audition (please see above for preparation requirements)
- Practical workshop activities which may include improvisation / voice / movement
- A short, informal interview

Candidates attending recall auditions should be prepared to repeat their original speeches from their first-round audition. Candidates should **also** prepare **two** new speeches, one of which should be modern / contemporary and one from the Elizabethan / Jacobean period.

We will notify candidates by email of their recall audition date approximately 2 to 3 weeks prior to the audition, this email will contain further details of the audition.

Final Recall auditions are expected to take place in during the week commencing 15 May 2023 at RWCMD in Cardiff. Please note that recall audition dates are fixed and if you cannot attend an audition in that week, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to consider your application.

For candidates unable to travel, we can offer final recall auditions online. Please note that online auditions will not include group work.

Final recall acting auditions may be filmed as part of the selection process. The recordings taken at these auditions are solely used to assist in the decision process and are only viewed by staff responsible for application decisions.

Feedback

Due to the large numbers of candidates attending our acting auditions, we regret that we are unable to provide individual feedback. The decision of the panel is final.

Advice to Candidates

- Candidates wishing to apply for both the MA and BA Acting courses must apply by the deadline for the BA (Hons) Acting and follow the BA audition process. Applicants wishing to be considered for both courses need <u>only</u> apply for the BA course, and note when booking their audition that they want to be considered for both courses.
- Auditions are only scheduled on weekdays; we are not able to offer any appointments on weekends.
 - We send information regarding auditions including Zoom links via email. On occasion emails can be sent to junk folders, please ensure you check your junk folders as well. If you have not received your Zoom link by the day prior to your audition, please contact us. Please do not wait until your audition start time.

The College places a high value on:

- The ability to 'inhabit' a character to understand and reveal their complex psychology.
- Willingness to take risks, but to exercise some sophistication in their execution.
- Generosity in working with others.
- Technical and expressive ability in voice, movement and singing.
- An active interest in, and knowledge of, theatre and related performing arts.
- Life experience we encourage applicants from a wide age range.

We also make the following specific recommendations:

- Make sure that you are secure in remembering the pieces you select.
- Avoid over-used speeches. If you have selected a piece from an audition book, the chances are that the panel may have seen the piece performed many times before.

- Avoid speeches by characters much older than yourself, unless the sentiments within it are universal.
- Avoid using an accent other than your own, unless you are absolutely secure in it.
- Avoid telephone speeches.
- Wear appropriate clothing which will allow you to move easily and comfortably.
- Do not use props.
- Enjoy the experience!

Preparing for your Zoom Audition - Tips & Advice

- Ensure you are ready for your audition in a suitable space; try to make your background as plain as possible and you may like to create a little space in your set up, to allow you to move around without leaving the shot.
- Please be sure that you are lit-well, that your recording device is placed on a tripod or flat surface, in your eyeline. We will need to be able to see you in full body with the facility of being able to come close to the camera too.
 - If using a mobile phone, please set up your device horizontally.
- Be in the waiting room a few minutes prior to your audition start time.
- Make sure your Wi-Fi is as stable as possible.
- We recommend that you familiarise yourself with Zoom before your audition day, including testing
 your sound and visual settings. You may find it useful set up a test call with a friend or family
 member. If possible, please download the Zoom app beforehand.
- When you enter the waiting room for your audition, your Zoom Name should match your name on your UCAS Conservatoire application.
